For kids, we now have a monthly lego day on the third Thursday of the month, and a monthly scavenger hunt for kids to do whenever they are at the library. We have had seasonal reading bingo for them for the past year.

State Aid: Thank you to Lloyd for signing. Nothing to report about the report. We met our requirements for state aid.

Staffing Costs: To have a circ assistant here 6 additional hours a week, which will cover all regular gaps in the schedule and most of the subbing needs, we would spend about \$3,600 from state aid for the rest of the fiscal year. This would increase to having two people working at one time for almost all scheduled hours. This is approximately 50% of what the state gave us last year for state aid.

The Trustees will include a staffing proposal to include this coverage in our FY25 budget.

Annual Plan: Our Director will write the Annual Plan for our internal use. We will review it at the next meeting.

Other

• Friends Update: There are about 10 active members. Finally the 125th Birthday Celebration happened with fun and good weather! About 125 people attended. There are the wood cutouts that have been a hit and the calendar for the Dog Show will come out with the winners of the event. This year will be the 2nd year as a return to the in-person Bazaar, and we expect it to be another great time! During the annual fund drive this year, the Friends collected about \$6000, a number of which were in the suggested \$125 amount. The annual fund drive, grants received, and gifts provide the majority of the Friends' bank balance to support all of the wonderful purchases and events provided by them.
